This question about MAGA has a simple answer historically audible during authoritarian regimes seeking to demonize and distract. The "other" is any group different or less powerful which can be the target of the culture war to distract people from the real objective: political power for the MAGA minority.

MAGA Republicans promise to lower taxes for the wealthy. Since the extremely wealthy are only 5% of the voters, they need culture wars to demonize certain issues to attract the required 40% of additional voters using various forms of bigotry, xenophobia and racism to target people their largely poorly educated voter base hates. Specific examples can be found in the anti-LGBTQ policies, anti-immigrant policies (except for Norwegians) and policies against noncaucasian people, such as anti-DEI*, anti-CRT*, and anti-affirmative action efforts. Creating fear that white Christian men are being replaced by others is a central message. The effort to gain support from additional fringe groups has resulted in abortion bans to satisfy extremist Christians and decreased gun regulations for the National Rifle Association (NRA) members.

The common theme is that groups representing the "other" are less powerful and different than white Christian red state voters in ethnicity, religion, education or lifestyle. All of this makes them easier targets for MAGA-aligned bigotry-based cruelty.

The cruelty continues from less powerful

groups of people to animals. We see MAGA Governor Kristy Noem bragging about shooting her puppy and a goat, claiming that it was a necessary part of country life. Be very careful if someone invites you out to their gravel pit in rural

red state America. The contrast between President Biden and MAGA on this issue is shocking. When Biden's dogs repeatedly bit Secret Service agents at the White House (only the Republican ones)*, they were not taken to the gravel pit and shot, but were sent to live at the Biden home in Delaware. MAGA animal cruelty continues with J. D. Vance attacking cats as part of his infamous "childless cat lady" comments. This theme continues with Trump's false debate claim that immigrants in Springfield, Ohio, were eating pets. Because this comment attacks animals and immigrants, internal MAGA advisors refer to it as a "two-fer".

Ongoing MAGA cruelty now extends downward from animals to defenseless inanimate objects, where the best examples are Trump hugging and kissing the American flag. 

"Berkeley's fresh approach to solving homelessness is simpler than it used to be," stated a city worker tossing a tent into a large dumpster. "No forms to fill out, no faking an offer of shelter."

"It takes so much less time just to ditch all their stuff and cart away the dumpster," stated Peter Radu, one of the homeless response team using a streamlined approach to clearing encampments informed by the recent Supreme Court decision on a case from Grants Pass, Oregon.

"City of Grants Pass v. Johnson allows us to criminalize the fact of having no place to go," nodded California Governor Gavin Newsom. "Everything once considered cruel and unusual punishment is scheduled

to 'move forward', as Kamala Harris would say.'

Councilmember Rashi Kesarwani is getting credit - or blame - for the "more nuanced" rules allowing Berkeley city crews to just trash people's belongings and tow poor attitude their vehicles whether or not there's any safe place being offered in return.


